
INTRODUCTION TO ONE POINT PERSPECTIVE DRAWING

YOUR GOAL: MAKE A COPY OF THE DRAWING BELOW



INSTRUCTIONS

1) Watch the video "How to draw a cube in 1 point perspective" by Student Art Guide or scan the QR Code



- 2). Look at the drawing on the front page and copy Cubes 1-6 on the attached page
 - Use the technique shown in the video. Put each cube in the same location as I have. Include the lines that connect to the vanishing point
 - Darken your final cube.
- 3) Watch the video "One Point Perspective Tutorial Stacking, Holes and Angles" by Student Art Guide or scan the QR Code.



- 3) Copy Cubes 7-10 like the drawing.
 - Draw Cube 7 somewhere below the vanishing line (like Mr. Wadge's picture) and draw a square hole in the cube.
 - Stack Cube 8 on top of Cube 5 (like Mr. Wadge's picture)
 - For #9: Draw an L shape on the bottom left corner (like Mr. Wadge) and connect it to the vanishing line.
 - For #10: Draw a triangle in between Cube 4 and 6 (like Mr. Wadge) and connect it to the vanishing line.
- 4) Use a new piece of paper (or the back of the attached paper) to write your name in block letters with one-point perspective.
 - You can use a word other than your name if you want but you need to draw at least three letters
 - Draw your own horizon line and vanishing point dot.
